HABEMUS PAPAM! WE HAVE A POPE! Leo XIV is the new Pope



"Peace be with all of you!" - the first words of Pope Leo XIV. Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost was selected as the 267th Successor of Peter by the 133 Cardinal electors on Thursday 8th May.

We pray that our new shepherd, Pope Leo XIV will be blessed with the wisdom and compassion needed to guide the Church. May he, in communion with his fellow bishops, serve us and God's people with dedication and joy, deep compassion, and profound faith, hope, and charity so that the light of the Risen Christ will continue to dispel the darkness of this world.

Dear friends.

The fourth Sunday of Easter each year is known as 'Good Shepherd Sunday' or 'World Day of Prayer for Vocations'. On this Sunday, the Gospel is always taken from the beautiful tenth chapter of St. John's Gospel where Jesus identifies himself as the Good Shepherd who cares for his sheep, gathers them and lays down his life for them. Both you and I are called to lay down our lives in the service of each other. And we do this in different ways, living a Life of Celibacy, living the Sacrament of Marriage, living a Vowed life of Consecration to God through Religious Life as a sister or brother, living the life of a Deacon or as a Priest. Each in their own way, are vocations of service.



I want to draw your attention to the 'Vocation of the Priest'. Without this Vocation how are we going to ensure the fulfilment of the Sacraments? Our need to foster Vocations to the Priesthood is imperative and each of us has a duty to encourage men to think about this vocation. Each one of us sees what is happening in the Priesthood and the shortages we are facing. We need to be proactive in promoting Vocations to the Priesthood. How might we do that? Create a prayer/discussion group within the parish; invite our young people, not only to be promoters of vocations, but to consider a vocation to the Priesthood or Religious Life; and to speak openly about vocations.

You have all met Michael Fury, our seminarian, who was on placement with us in January, Michael will be speaking about his call to the Priesthood at all of our Masses this weekend. Let us continue to pray for Michael and Lukas our second seminarian, who please God you will meet in the not-too-distant future. Please keep your prayers for Markanthony who will be starting Valladolid in September.

Our late Holy Father, Pope Francis, wrote the 61st Letter for Vocations Sunday, just before his death. Which can be found in full on our parish website.



The courage to commit

In this light, I would say once more, as I did at World Youth Day in Lisbon: "Rise up!" Let us awaken from sleep, let us leave indifference behind, let us open the doors of the prison in which we so often enclose ourselves, so that each of us can discover his or her proper vocation in the Church and in the world, and become a pilgrim of hope and a builder of peace! Let us be passionate about life and commit ourselves to caring lovingly for those around us, in every place where we live.
