A Loving Heart for All: Pope Leo XIV Invites Us to Embrace the Poor

Our Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV, has released his first apostolic exhortation, Dilexi te, offering a powerful and hopeful message for all Christians. The title, Latin for "I have loved you," sets the tone for a beautiful and challenging call to action: to see the poor not as a problem to be solved, but as a cherished part of our family.

A message of continuity and hope

In this new document, Pope Leo builds on the legacy of Pope Francis and previous popes, emphasising that caring for the poor is not an optional activity but a fundamental requirement of our faith. He reminds us that Christ himself became poor for our sake and is present in the "least of these".

For our parish, this is a wonderful affirmation that our efforts—from our food bank to our outreach programs—are at the very heart of the Gospel. It's a reminder that through acts of mercy, we are not just helping others; we are encountering Christ himself.

Seeing Christ in our neighbours

The Pope encourages a "change in mentality" that moves us away from indifference and toward a deeper recognition of every person's dignity. He highlights the many "faces of poverty", which include not only a lack of material goods but also social exclusion and marginalisation.

This message is an invitation for all of us to look at our community with fresh eyes. Who are the people on the peripheries of our own lives? It could be the elderly neighbour who needs a visit, the family struggling to make ends meet, or the lonely person who sits quietly in the back pew. By simply seeing and acknowledging them, we answer Pope Leo's call to bring them into our family.

A legacy of saints and service

Dilexi te is filled with inspiring stories of saints throughout history who dedicated their lives to the poor, from St. Francis of Assisi to St. Teresa of Calcutta. These examples show us that love for the poor has always been at the heart of the Church's mission and that every act of charity, no matter how small, can be a powerful force for change.

An action plan for our parish

As we reflect on Pope Leo's message, let us be inspired to renew our commitment to service. This week, consider how you can put his words into action:

Volunteer: Give an hour or two of your time to our parish's outreach programs.

Pray: Remember those who are struggling in your daily prayers.

Connect: Reach out to someone in our parish you haven't spoken to before.

Pope Leo XIV's first apostolic exhortation is not a scolding but a loving call to joy. It reminds us that our faith is most vibrant and alive when we act with compassion toward those who need it most. Let's embrace his message and bring renewed hope and charity to our parish and community.
